The primary objective of these Guidelines is to ensure that Government websites are universally accessible, usable and citizen centric. The compliance to these Guidelines by any Government website will enable the content to be made audible with the help of appropriate speech engine. These Guidelines have been communicated to all Ministries / Departments of Government of India for compliance. They have also been adopted as a part of the Manual of Office Procedure of the Government of India.
