Will the Minister of COALHOME AFFAIRS be pleased to state :-

- (a) whether it is a fact that Chinese troops intruded by one and half km. into Indian territory in Ladakh area and painted many stones red with China marks;
- (b) if so, the details thereof;
- (c) whether our security forces secured the territory and removed China marks on the stones;
- (d) if not, the reasons therefor; and
- (e) the Chinese version of the incident?

(a) to (e): China disputes the International Boundary between India and China. There is no commonly delineated Line of Actual Control (LAC) between the two countries. From time to time, on account of differences in the perception of the LAC, some incidents of violations are reported. Government regularly takes up any violation along the LAC with the Chinese side through established mechanisms including the Joint Working Group, the Expert Group, border personnel meetings, flag meetings and diplomatic channels.
