Will the Minister of HOME AFFAIRS be pleased to state :-

- (a) whether Government is considering any proposal of conducting courses on police related subject by setting up a National Police University or by using existing infrastructure of universities in the country;
- (b) if so, the details of the considerations made by the Ministry; and
- (c) by when it will be started?

ANSWER

- (a) Government is getting conducted the courses on police related subjects by using existing infrastructure of universities in the country for which initiatives have already been undertaken through the Bureau of Police Research and Development. The proposal for establishment of National Police University has been withdrawn, in view of the inherent merits in conducting such courses through existing universities.
- (b) & (c): Bureau of Police Research and Development (BPR&D) has entered into a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with 31 universities to promote advanced studies and research on police related subjects. Courses on police related subjects are already being conducted in 9 universities and a few more institutions like GTB Khalsa College, Delhi and National Law Institute University, Bhopal have agreed to start such courses in the academic year-2010-11.
