(a) to (e): The approved state plan outlay for Chhattisgarh has increased from Rs. 7,413.72 crore in 2007-08 to Rs. 13,230 crore in 2010-11. The actual achievement was 83.6% in 2007-08, 84.76% in 2008-09 and 85.44% in 2009-10. Per-capita GSDP and per-capita plan expenditure have been increasing over time. Central assistance to State Plan has also increased from Rs. 626 crore in 2007-08 to Rs. 2,302 crore in 2010-11 (AP). Further, Rs. 3,389 crore were released during 2009-10 under the Centrally Sponsored Schemes to the state.

As regards the schemes under public distribution system and food security, the State Government has informed that under Targeted Public Distribution System (TPDS), 75% families of Lift Wing Extremism (LWE) affected areas are getting foodgrain at subsidised rates (i.e. Antyodaya Anna Yojana (AAY) – Rs. 1 per kg and BPL categories – Rs. 2 per kg). As per the information provided by the State Government, 10.32 lakh families also getting foodgrain through 3386 FPS under "Door Step Delivery Scheme".

Different states including Chhattisgarh are implementing their own plan schemes, Additional Central Assistance (ACA) schemes with central assistance and Centrally Sponsored Schemes (CSS) with substantial financial assistance from the Centre.
