(c): To give impetus to female literacy, a new variant of the National Literacy Mission was launched on 8th September, 2009, with the objective of providing opportunities in continuing education, basic education (equivalency), skill development and functional literacy to adults, specially women, in the age group of 15 years and above. One of the specific goals of the programme is to reduce gender gap in literacy to 10% as against 21% as indicated in the Census of 2001. As women constitute a majority of the targetted beneficiaries, the programme has been given gender treatment. Districts having low adult female literacy rate of 50% or below, as per Census of 2001, alone are eligible for coverage under this programme.
