Will the Minister of HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state :-

- (a) whether Government has planned for special incentives to lure faculty from the older Indian Institutes of Technology (IITs) to raise the teaching posts at the new breed of IITs struggling to attract teachers;
- (b) if so, the details thereof;
- (c) whether new IITs are facing a fund crunch; and
- (d) if so, the details thereof and the action taken by Government in this regard?

ANSWER

(a) & (b) : There is a proposal that the faculty and other employees working under the Central Government or Central Autonomous Bodies and who are covered under the CCS (Pension) Rules, 1972 or an identical pension scheme before 01.01.2004, should be entitled to join / continue to work in the newly set up Central Education Institutions (CEIs) on long term deputation basis upto a period of ten years. This is subject to payment of both leave salary and pension contribution at prescribed rate with reference to the higher pay drawn by these employees from time to time by the borrowing organization concerned.

(c) & (d) : Adequate funds have been provided. In BE 2010- 11, Rs. 400 crores have been provided for these 8 new IITs.
