STATEMENT REFERRED TO IN REPLY TO PARTS (a) TO (f) OF THE UNSTARRED QUESTION NO. 611 BY SHRI Y.P.TRIVEDI TO BE ANSWERED IN RAJYA SABHA ON 12.11.2010 REGARDING MORTUARY FOR ACCIDENT VICTIMS.

- (a):No person lost his life in consequential train accident in the Mumbai Suburban area during January to October, 2010.
- (b) to (f):On Central Railway, in Central Hospital at Byculla and Divisional Hospital at Kalyan, air-conditioned mortuaries having capacity for 7 and 4 bodies, respectively, have been provided. On Western Railway, in Jagjivan Ram Hospital at Mumbai Central, air-conditioned mortuary with a capacity for 6 bodies has been provided.
