COMPREHENSIVE CANCER CONTROL MECHANISM.

Will the Minister of COALCOALCOALCOALHEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE be pleased to state :-

- (a) whether it is a fact that Government is considering to bring in a comprehensive cancer control mechanism on the scale of the existing measures to combat HIV and tuberculosis;
- (b) it so, the details thereof;
- (c) whether Government has any plan to expand cancer prevention, diagnosis, treatment and palliation across the country; and
- (d) if so, the details thereof?

(a to d): The Government has recently revised the National Cancer Control Programme and reformulated a comprehensive National Programme for Prevention and Control of Cancer, Diabetes, Cardiovascular Diseases & Stroke (NPCDCS) for the remaining two years of the 11th Five Year Plan. During the year 2010 -11 and 2011-12, a provision of Rs. 1230.90 crore has been made for NPCDCS out of which Rs. 731.52 crore is for Cancer component. The new programme envisages implementation in 100 districts of 21 States. The objectives of the new programme include prevention and control of common non-communicable diseases(NCDs) which includes cancer, through behaviour and life style changes; provide early diagnosis and management of common NCDs, build capacity at various levels of health care for prevention diagnosis and treatment of common NCDs; train human resource with the public health set-up to cope with the increasing burden of NCDs and establish and develop capacity for palliative & rehabilitative care.
