- (a) & (b) Yes. Government of India launched a project titled "National Vector Borne Disease Control Project" with the World Bank assistance for a period of five years from 2008-09 to 2012-13 for malaria control and kala-azar elimination.
- (c) The State of Uttar Pradesh has not been included in the World Bank supported project due to low endemicity of malaria in the State.
