As per the Annexure to the Joint Statement on the UK-India Summit 2015, King's College Hospital, NHS Foundation Trust and Indo-UK Healthcare Pvt. Ltd. have signed an agreement to open King's College Hospital, Chandigarh. This is the first of a proposed eleven new UK-Indo Institutes for Health that will be developed across India, which when fully implemented, would amount to a GBP 1 billion investment into India's healthcare system, accompanied by strategic clinical and training partnerships with UK's NHS organizations, universities and private sector companies.
