# RAJYA SABHA STARRED QUESTION NO.215 TO BE ANSWERED ON THE 6<sup>TH</sup> DECEMBER, 2016 PRINTING OF NUTRITIONAL CONTENTS IN HINDI AND REGIONAL LANGUAGES ON FOOD PACKETS

#### \*215. SHRI DILIP KUMAR TIRKEY:

Will the Minister of **HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE** be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is a fact that printing of nutritional contents on food packets in English language only is a major obstacle in spreading nutritional literacy among general masses; and
- (b) if so, whether Government is considering to issue guidelines to food packaging industries to print nutritional contents in Hindi and possibly in regional languages also, along with English; and
- (c) if not, the reasons therefor?

## ANSWER THE MINISTER OF HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE (SHRI JAGAT PRAKASH NADDA)

(a) to (c): A statement is laid on the Table of the House

### STATEMENT REFERRED TO IN REPLY TO RAJYA SABHA STARRED QUESTION NO. 215\* FOR 6<sup>TH</sup> DECEMBER, 2016

(a): Regulation 2.2, sub-regulation 2.2.1, clause (2) of the Food Safety and Standards (Packaging and Labelling) Regulations, 2011, prescribes the General Labelling requirements of every pre-packed food items, as follows:

"The particulars of declaration required under these Regulations to be specified on the label shall be in English or Hindi in Devnagri script:

Provided that nothing herein contained shall prevent the use of any other language in addition to the language required under this regulation."

(b)&(c): No. In the light of the Regulations referred at (a) above, at present, the Government is not considering issuing any fresh guidelines to Packaged Food industries about printing the nutritional contents.

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
