DELAY IN LAUNCHING OF HIV PREVENTION PROJECT

1381. SHRI RIPUN BORA:

Will the Minister of HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is a fact that the launch of HIV prevention project in the country is delayed by about 9 months' time;
- (b) if so, present status of the first ever Pre-Exposure Prophylaxis medicine testing project therein;
- (c) the report of WHO on the project and availability of medicines therefor; and
- (d) the initiative of the Drug Controller General of India (DGCI) on the project and their technical support therein?

ANSWER THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE (SMT. ANUPRIYA PATEL)

(a) to (d): No. NACO is not aware of any such launch of HIV prevention project.

NACO is aware of one Indio-foreign research project on PrEP commissioned by Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR) titled "Closing a critical HIV prevention gap: demonstrating safety and effective delivery of daily oral pre-exposure prophylaxix (PrEP) as part of an HIV combination preventive intervention for sex workers in Kolkata and Mysore-Mandya, India," which is funded by NIH, USA.
