Deaths and injuries due to Jallikkattu

3415. DR. T. SUBBARAMI REDDY:

Will the Minister of ENVIRONMENT, FOREST AND CLIMATE CHANGE be pleased to state:

- (a) the number of persons and bulls which died and number of persons injured in Tamil Nadu as on date, after the passage of Prevention of Cruelty to Animal (Tamil Nadu Amendment) Act, 2017, which facilitated holding of Jallikkattu in the State;
- (b) whether the guidelines and regulations framed by the Supreme Court and Government agencies were followed by the organisers; and
- (c) if not, whether action was taken against the violators who committed cruelty and mental and physical torture on bulls and if not, the reasons therefor?

(a) and (b) Animal Welfare Board of India constituted Jallikattu Inspection Committee and inspected around 40 events in coordination with Tami Nadu Government. Pre-Inspection was made before the event to see the arrangements which were normally found as per guidelines. As per the information made available by the Animal Husbandry Department of Government of Tamil Nadu, the details of number of persons and bulls which died and number of persons injured in Tamil Nadu after the passage of Prevention of Cruelty to Animal (Tamil Nadu Amendment) Act, 2017 are as under:-
