## New airports under regional connectivity scheme

## 4016. SHRI HARSHVARDHAN SINGH DUNGARPUR

Will the Minister of CIVIL AVIATION be pleased to state:-

(a) whether Government has taken a decision to establish new airports as a part of regional connectivity scheme, if so, the details thereof;

(b) the quantum of funds allocated and released so far to these works;

(c) whether these projects are being developed with the expenditure of Central Government or any State share is also proposed for their early execution, the details thereof; and

(d) the details of the regional airports interconnected under this scheme?

#### ANSWER

## MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF CIVIL AVIATION

(Shri Jayant Sinha)

(a) to (c): Establishment of new airports is not covered under Regional Connectivity Scheme (RCS) - UDAN. However, Government has approved the proposal for revival of 50 unserved / under-served airports/airstrips of the State Governments, Airports Authority of India and Civil enclaves at an estimated cost of Rs. 4500 crores. The revival of airstrips/airports is 'demand driven', depending upon firm commitment from airline operators as well as from the State Government for providing various concessions.

The details of likely expenditure for up-gradation of RCS airports in first and second round of bidding is at Annexure-I
(d): RCS Flights commenced from 20 RCS (Unserved and Underserved) airports in 1st round of bidding under RCS-UDAN are as under: Agra, Bhatinda, Bikaner, Diu, Gwalior, Jaisalmer, Jalgaon, Jamnagar, Kadapa, Kandla, Ludhiana, Mundra, Mysore, Nanded, Nasik, Puducherry, Porbandar, Salem, Shimla & Vidyanagar.
