LONG WAITING TIME FOR SURGERY AT AIMS, NEW DELHI

4117. SHRI VEER SINGH:

Will the Minister of **HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE** be pleased to state:

- (a) whether Government is aware that a large number of serious patients are not getting admission in the All India Institute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS), New Delhi and have to wait for years for undergoing surgeries;
- (b) if so, the details thereof and reactions of Government thereto;
- (c) the number of patients registered during the last three years in AIIMS Surgery Department and the number of patients operated upon and referred to other hospitals due to non-availability of beds; and
- (d) corrective steps taken by Government to increase the number of beds and other facilities in the Surgery Department?

ANSWER THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE (ASHWINI KUMAR CHOUBEY)

- (a) & (b): The number of patients coming to AIIMS, New Delhi, for treatment/surgery is more than the beds available in the Institute. However, the Surgery Department of the Institute prepares waiting lists of the patients needing admission according to the condition of patients, urgency of treatment and availability of beds on a particular day. In the casualty/emergency life saving situations, all efforts are made to admit seriously ill patients in the hospital as far as possible. In case of non-availability of beds in the emergency, the patients are first stabilized and then sent to other Government hospitals for further management.
- (c): The number of patients registered during the last three years in AIIMS Surgery Department and the number of patients operated upon is as under:
