Will the Minister of HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE be pleased to state:

- (a) whether Government has identified some districts in the country as most backward in health care;
- (b) if so, the details thereof particularly those located in Assam and other North Eastern States;
- (c) whether Government has decided to make available basic services in the health sector in these districts; and
- (d) if so, whether Government has finalized the action plan for a Uniform Policy to bring the backward districts at par?

ANSWER THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE (SHRI ASHWINI KUMAR CHOUBEY)

- (a): Government has identified certain High Priority Districts (HPDs) that have relatively poor health indicators.
- (b): The list is annexed.
- (C) & (d): The High Priority Districts (HPDs) receive focused health care interventions under National Rural Health Mission. These districts have higher per capita funding, relaxed norms, enhanced monitoring and focused supportive supervision, and are encouraged to adopt innovative approaches to address their peculiar health challenges.
