Will the Minister of CONSUMER AFFAIRS, FOOD AND PUBLIC DISTRIBUTION be pleased to state:

- (a) the details of increase in wholesale and retail price of food items in the last three years;
- (b) whether inflation has increased in October-November as compared to last year, if so, the reasons therefor and the reasons of failure of Government mechanism in controlling the price rise; and
- (c) the details of obstructions coming in the way of controlling the price rise of essential food items?

(a) : Details of increase in wholesale and retail prices of food items for the last three years, as per the Consumer Food Price Index (CFPI) and Wholesale Price Index (WPI- Food Index) brought out by Ministry of Statistics and Programme Implementation (MoSPI) and Department of Industrial Policy and Promotion (DIPP) respectively are as under:
