- (c) whether it is also a fact that Government is considering to make air links with Myanmar, Cambodia and Vietnam from where a large number of Buddhist tourists wish to visit India; and
- (d) if so, the details thereof?

(a) to (d): Government of India has allocated sufficient traffic rights to Indian carriers for operation to and from China, Cambodia, Japan, Malaysia, Myanmar, Sri Lanka, Thailand and Vietnam to boost Buddhist tourism. However, actual start of operation of an airline depends upon the commercial judgement, route viability and availability of aircraft and other resources.
