Amount spent under PMMSY

1375. SHRI ABDUL WAHAB:

Will the Minister of FISHERIES, ANIMAL HUSBANDRY AND DAIRYING be pleased to state:

- (a) the details of amount spent under the Pradhan Mantri Matsya Sampada Yojana (PMMSY);
- (b) the amount that has been spent for the welfare of women involved in fishing or belonging to fishing communities from this fund;
- (c) the amount allotted under PMMSY which is spent in the State of Kerala; and
- (d) the details of the same?

ANSWER

THE MINISTER FOR FISHERIES, ANIMAL HUSBANDRY AND DAIRYING

(a) and (b): The Department of Fisheries, Ministry of Fisheries, Animal Husbandry & Dairying is implementing a flagship scheme Pradhan Mantri Matsya Sampada Yojana (PMMSY)- A scheme to bring about Blue Revolution through sustainable and responsible development of fisheries sector in India for a period of five years with effect from the financial year 2020-21 to 2024-25 in all States/Union Territories(UTs). The Department of Fisheries during the financial year 2020-21 has accorded approvals to the proposals of 34 States/UTs and other organizations at a total cost of Rs. 2881.41 crore with central share of Rs. 1089.80 crore and released a sum of Rs. 699.72 crore to the States/UTs and other organizations under the PMMSY. This includes the project proposals worth Rs. 459.99 crore with central share of Rs. 191.38 crore approved under the PMMSY for providing financial assistance to women beneficiaries involved in fisheries related activities.

(c) and (d): The Department of Fisheries, Ministry of Fisheries, Animal Husbandry & Dairying, during 2020-21, under the PMMSY has accorded approval to the fisheries development proposal of Government of Kerala at a total cost of Rs. 113.67 crore with the central share of Rs 42.33 crore and the Government of Kerala has reported utilization of the first installment of Central share of Rs. 8 crore released during 2020-21 for implementation of this proposal in the State. The activities under the aforesaid approved fisheries development proposal of Government of Kerala include Re-circulatory Aquaculture System (RAS), Biofloc culture systems, Deep Sea Fishing Vessels for traditional fishermen, up-gradation of existing fishing vessels, Brood Bank, Aquatic Referral Laboratories, Integrated Development of Reservoirs and Sagar Mitras.
