DISPARITY IN PER CAPITA INCOME

Will the Minister of Planning be pleased to state:

- (a) whether there has been a huge disparities with respect to per capita income of different States during the last three years, if so, the details thereof;
- (b) whether the factors responsible for the widening gap in per capita income among the States have been analysed; and
- (c) whether appropriate steps have been taken by Government to reduce disparity and the details thereof?

- (a) As per the information received from M/o Statistics and programme Implementation (MOSPI), the State-wise Per Capita Income measured in terms of Per capita Net State Domestic Product (NSDP) at current and constant (2011-12) prices for the last three years are given at **Annexure**.
- (b) & (c): Government has been focusing on inclusive growth as reflected in its commitment of Sabka Saath, Sabka Vikas and has taken various steps to address the rural urban disparity. "Gaon, Gareeb aur Kisan" has been at the centre of government policies. Government has been implementing a number of targeted programmes to improve the per capita income of both rural and urban India for overall balanced development in the country. Government has also implemented the Aspirational Districts Programme aimed at comprehensive development of backward areas in six areas: (i) health & nutrition, (ii) education, (iii) agriculture & water resources, (iv) financial inclusion, (v) skill development, and (vi) basic infrastructure. Several measures have also been taken to increase growth and consumption in both rural and urban India under the Aatmanirbhar Bharat Abhiyan, including Pradhan Mantri Garib Kalyan Yojana. The Union Budget 2021-22 has also announced a number of measures to support broad-based and inclusive economic development. Key measures include ensuring Minimum Support Price (MSP) at minimum 1.5 times the cost of production across all commodities, extension of SWAMITVA Scheme to all States/UTs, enhancing agricultural credit and infrastructure funds, investments to develop modern fishing harbours and fish landing centres, etc.
