STATUS OF PRADHAN MANTRI JAN VIKAS KARYAKRAM

*341. DR. V. SIVADASAN:

Will the Minister of MINORITY AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

- (a) the status of Pradhan Mantri Jan Vikas Karyakram in Kerala;
- (b) whether the scheme has stopped;
- (c) if so, the reasons therefor; and
- (d) if not, whether Government intends to increase the funds proportional to the increased number of districts included in the scheme?

STATEMENT REFERRED TO IN REPLY TO PARTS (a) TO (d) OF RAJYA SABHA STARRED QUESTION NO. 341 TO BE ANSWERED ON 04.04.2022 ASKED BY HON'BLE MEMBER OF PARLIAMENT DR. V. SIVADASAN REGARDING "STATUS OF PRADHAN MANTRI JAN VIKAS KARYAKRAM"

(a) to (d) Ministry of Minority Affairs is implementing Pradhan Mantri Jan Vikas Karyakram (PMJVK) and has extended the area of coverage and scope of the scheme to all the districts of the country including all districts of Kerala with effect from 2022-23 from the earlier 308 Districts in 33 States/UTs of the country.

The areas covered under PMJVK in Kerala were increased in May 2018 from only 2 Districts originally to 13 Districts and from 2022-23 onwards all 14 Districts of Kerala namely, Alappuzha, Ernakulam, Idukki, Kannur, Kasaragod, Kollam, Kottayam, Kozhikode, Malappuram, Palakkad, Pathanamthitta, Thiruvananthapuram, Thrissur and Wayanad are covered under PMJVK.

Since the year 2014-15, a total of 1946 projects worth Rs. 242.26 crore have been sanctioned under PMJVK in the State of Kerala, which includes 54-School Buildings, 01-Hostel, 13-Additional Class Rooms (ACRs), 03-Smart Class Rooms, 17-Toilets, 01-ITI, 03-Skill Centres, 13-Health Related Projects, 15 Drinking Water Facilities, 10-Common Service Centres (CSCs), 02-Hunar Hubs, 02-Market Sheds, 01-Sadbhav Mandap, 1807-Bicycles, 03-Working Women Hostels and 01-Seminar Hall. This also includes 19 projects worth Rs. 129.93 crore approved during 2021-22. The major projects approved during this period are Construction of Skill Development Centre at Nilambur, Malapuram at a cost of Rs.7.92 crore, Construction of Girls' Hostel Building at Nilambur, Malapuram at a cost of Rs. 9.97 crore, Construction of Integrative Centre for Ayurveda, Yoga and Naturopathy at Malapuram for Rs.7 crore, Construction of Advanced Medical Complex for Taluk Hospital (New Block), Malapuram at a cost of Rs. 9.72 crore and Construction of Government District Hospital at Vatakara, Phase II at a cost of Rs. 83.18 crore.

Apart from these, 2 Hostels for Central University, Kerala amounting to Rs. 38.22 crore in Kasaragod, 2 Hostels for off campus centre of Aligarh Muslim University in Malapuram amounting to Rs. 49.15 crore, 11 Smart Class Rooms for Jawahar Navodaya Vidyalaya amounting to Rs.0.33 crore in Malapuram and 163 Smart Class Rooms for Kendriya Vidyalaya amounting to Rs. 7.36 crore in Wayanad, Kasaragod,

Kottayam, Alappuzha, Kolam, Kannur, Kozhikode and Palakkad have been approved under PMJVK scheme in the State of Kerala.

Further, since the year 2014-15, the Ministry has sanctioned projects worth Rs.18257.89 crore under PMJVK. During this period more than 49,000 major projects have been sanctioned which includes 38 Degree Colleges, 177 Residential Schools, 1,550 School Buildings, 23,094 Additional Class Rooms, 14,312 Teaching Aid & Smart Classrooms, 691 Hostels, 27 Working Women Hostels, 94 ITI Buildings and additional facilities in 17 ITIs, 14 Polytechnics, 31 Skill Centres, 2324 Health Projects, 01 Medical college, 01 Unani Medical College, 01 Nursing Hostel and upgradation of Hamidiya Hospital at Gandhi Medical College and linked hospitals in Bhopal, 01 Agriculture College, 01 Medical Hunar Hub project comprising of a 300 bedded hospital, a Nursing College, a Paramedical College and a Pharmacy College, a Skill Development Centre alongwith hostels with 2300 bedded capacity and also a 200 bedded Working Women Hostel, 413 Sadhbhav Mandaps, 01 Sadbhav Kendra, 170 Common Service Centres, 553 Market Sheds, 12 Hunar Hubs, 6742 Sanitation/Toilet projects, 91 Sports Facilities including Augmentation of Luwangpokpa Cricket Stadium in Manipur and Upgradation of P.A. Sangma Outdoor Stadium in Meghalaya, etc.

The Government has approved a total outlay of Rs.9340 crore for implementation of the scheme during 15th Finance Commission cycle i.e. 2021-22 to 2025-26, which is an increase of about 47% from the total allocation of Rs. 6371 crore during previous five financial years i.e. 2016-17 to 2020-21.
