MARITIME TOURISM IN THE COUNTRY

1906# SHRI BRIJLAL:

Will the Minister of **TOURISM** be pleased to state:

- (a) whether Government is aware of immense potential of maritime tourism in the country and if so, the details thereof;
- (b) whether Government has prepared any comprehensive roadmap for the development of maritime tourism keeping in mind the infrastructure creation, skill development and employment generation etc., if so, the details along with its salient features thereof; and
- (c) the steps taken by Government in the coastal States including Goa to promote maritime tourism?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF TOURISM

(SHRI G. KISHAN REDDY)

(a) to (c): Promotion and Development of Tourism, including Maritime Tourism, is primarily the responsibility of the State Governments/ Union Territory Administrations.

However, Ministry of Tourism has provided financial assistance to States/UTs under Coastal Circuit theme under Swadesh Darshan Scheme. Details of projects sanctioned under Coastal Circuit theme of Swadesh Darshan Scheme in the country, including Goa, are given at **Annexure I**.

Apart from the above, Ministry of Tourism provides Central Financial Assistance (CFA) to the State Governments/ UT Administrations/ Central Government Agencies for development of Tourism including Cruise Tourism and Cruising along rivers. Details of projects sanctioned for the development of Cruise Terminals and related infrastructure under the Scheme for 'Assistance to Central Agencies for Tourism Infrastructure Development' are given at **Annexure II**.

In addition, National Institute of Water Sports (NIWS), Goa is a central autonomous body under the Ministry of Tourism, for training and certification in water sports and related activities. National Institute of Water Sports, Goa is mandated to impart training in water related sports activities across all States and UTs.
