As such there is no pending project in the National Waterways of Odisha. Government of India has declared 06 National Waterways (NW) in the State of Odisha. They are namely NW-5, NW-14, NW-22, NW-23, NW-64 and NW-96. Based on the findings of Feasibility Study Reports (FSR)/Detailed Projects Report (DPR) of these National Waterways (NWs), 212 Km stretch of NW-5 from Pankapal-Dhamra Port-Mangalgadi-Paradip Port has been taken up for development.

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
