Will the Minister of **JAL SHAKTI** be pleased to state:

- (a) present status of second phase of the Swachh Bharat Mission-Grameen (SBM-G);
- (b) budget allocation for SBM (G) during 2022-23;
- (c) State/UT-wise details of IHHLs constructed and financial incentive provided since 2019;
- (d) whether Government is providing assistance to States in the form of financial, technical and capacity building support for the process of solid and liquid waste management in rural areas of the country;
- (e) number of villages having arrangements for SWM, LWM and having both functional solid and liquid waste management plants in the country, State-wise; and
- (f) names of top five performing States where maximum number of villages have been declared as ODF Plus?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF JAL SHAKTI (SHRI GAJENDRA SINGH SHEKHAWAT)

(a) to (f) Swachh Bharat Mission (Grameen) [SBM(G)] Phase-II was launched with effect from 1st April, 2020, with the objective to sustain the Open Defecation Free (ODF) status of villages and to cover all villages with Solid and Liquid Waste Management (SLWM), i.e. to convert the villages from ODF to ODF Plus, by 2024-25. In order to ensure that no one is left behind in having access to toilets, provision of providing financial incentive of Rs.12,000 for the new households and any left out households is also continued under the programme.

Sanitation being a State subject, the programme is implemented by the State/UT Governments. Government of India provides technical and financial support by way of issuing guidelines, manuals, advisories, and providing grants-in-aid, to the States/UTs to facilitate them for smooth implementation of the programme. During 2022-23, an amount of Rs.7,192 crore has been allocated for SBM(G) under Budget Estimates (BE).

Department of Drinking Water and Sanitation (DDWS) has also been providing capacity building support to the States/UTs by organizing the orientations, workshops on technical components of ODF Plus, and creating Master Trainers in the States/UTs who further train the various stakeholders at State, Districts, Block, Gram Panchayat levels, etc. Government of India is also associating Development Partners in supporting the States/UTs.

As reported by the States/UTs on the online Integrated Management Information System (IMIS), from 2019-20 to 2022-23 (till 14.12.2022), 2.02 crore individual household latrines (IHHLs) and 1.97 lakh Community Sanitary Complexes (CSCs) are reported to have been constructed under SBM(G). State/UT-wise details are given at **Annexure-1**. 1,24,029 villages are reported to have been covered with Solid Waste Management and 1,08,951 villages with Liquid Waste Management. Out of these, 71,387 villages are reported to have been covered with both Solid Waste Management and Liquid Waste Management. State/UT-wise details are given at **Annexure-2**.

Further, 1,42,799 villages have declared themselves ODF Plus. Madhya Pradesh, Karnataka, Uttar Pradesh, Telangana and Odisha are the top five performing States with maximum number of ODF Plus declared villages. State/UT-wise details of ODF Plus declared villages are given at **Annexure-3**.
