Drug trafficking through sea routes

68. Shri Sanjay Raut:

Will the Minister of *Finance* be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that drug trafficking through sea routes is estimated to account for around 70 per cent of total illegal drugs smuggled into the country;

(b) if so, the details thereof; and

(c) what are the steps Government is taking to control the smuggling of drugs into the country?

(a) to (c) A statement is laid on the table of the House.

Statement referred to in reply to Rajya Sabha Starred Question No. 68 for answer on December 13, 2022 raised by Shri Sanjay Raut, Member of Parliament regarding 'Drug trafficking through sea routes'

(a) As per inputs received from Narcotics Control Bureau (NCB), main drugs smuggled through sea route are Heroin, Cocaine, Hashish and Amphetamine type Stimulants (ATS). The percentage of these drugs smuggled through sea route vis a vis total seizures is significant, though their percentage varies from year to year.

(b) The details are as follows:

(c) Various Central law enforcement agencies and state police departments monitor and control drug smuggling in India. A Narco Co-ordination Centre (NCORD) has been set up by the Ministry of Home Affairs for effective co-ordination among various law enforcement agencies. A dedicated Anti Narcotics Task Force has been established in each of the 35 states/ union territories to control menace of drug trafficking. The Multi-Agency Maritime Security Group (MAMSG) set up under the aegis of National Security Council Secretariat, also monitors smuggling of drugs through sea routes.
