PPP MODEL AIRPORTS IN THE COUNTRY

Will the Minister of CIVIL AVIATION be pleased to state:-

- (a) the list of Public Private Partnership (PPP) model airports operating in the country;
- (b) whether the PPP model is making profits;
- (c) if so, the list of PPP model airports that are making profits and those making losses; and
- (d) the list of PPP model airports to be set up in the near future and the detailed list thereof?

ANSWER

Minister of State in the Ministry of CIVIL AVIATION (GEN. (DR) V. K. SINGH (RETD))

(a) to (c): Presently, there are 13 airports in the country which are being operated under the Public Private Partnership (PPP) mode. Of these 13, eight (8) airports belong to the Airports Authority of India (AAI) viz. Delhi, Mumbai, Lucknow, Ahmedabad, Mangaluru, Jaipur, Guwahati, Thiruvananthapuram. Remaining five (5) airports i.e. Hyderabad, Bengaluru, Cochin, Kannur and Durgapur belong to the respective State Governments.

Implementation of PPP at airports has been a success story. PPP at the airports has helped in creating world class airports and delivery of efficient and quality services to the airport passengers which is reflected from the fact that PPP airports viz. Delhi, Mumbai, Bangalore and Hyderabad constantly feature among the top five global airports in their respective categories in the Airport Service Quality (ASQ) ratings published by the Airports Council International and Skytrax Research Awards. PPP at airports has also helped AAI in enhancing its revenues and focusing on developing airports at Tier-II and Tier-III cities.

Profit/loss details of the above mentioned 13 PPP airports during FY 2018-19 to FY 2020-21 are at Annexure.

(d): As per National Monetization Pipeline (NMP), 25 Airports Authority of India (AAI) airports namely Bhubaneshwar, Varanasi, Amritsar, Trichy, Indore, Raipur, Calicut, Coimbatore, Nagpur, Patna, Madurai, Surat, Ranchi, Jodhpur, Chennai, Vijayawada, Vadodara, Bhopal, Tirupati, Hubli, Imphal, Agartala, Udaipur, Dehradun and Rajahmundry have been earmarked for leasing over the years 2022 to 2025. Further, one PPP greenfield airport at Mopa (Goa) has been inaugurated on 11 December, 2022 and is ready for operationalisation. Construction work at another two PPP greenfield airports namely Noida International Airport (Jewar) and Navi Mumbai International Airport has commenced.
