GAP IN THE ADMINISTRATION OF VACCINES TO CHILDREN

1564: SHRI BINOY VISWAM:

Will the Minister of **HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE** be pleased to state:

- (a) the details of the number of children who missed their vaccine shots under the Universal Immunisation Programmes since March 2020, year-wise and State-wise;
- (b) whether Government had issued advisories to States to take steps to boost vaccine measures for children prior to the ongoing measles outbreak; and
- (c) the steps taken by Government to keep the vaccine programmes for children on-track during the COVID-19 pandemic?

ANSWER

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE (DR. BHARATI PRAVIN PAWAR)

- (a) Total number of children unvaccinated/partially vaccinated since March 2020, year-wise and State-wise is placed at Annexure I. Intensified Mission Indradhanush is conducted every year to immunize unvaccinated and partially vaccinated children.
- (b) and (c): Government had issued advisories to States/UTs guiding to boost vaccination measures for children. In addition, following steps were taken by the Government to keep the vaccine programme for children on-track during the COVID-19 pandemic:
 - Considering Immunization as an essential service, States/ UTs were provided with a series
 of guidelines to ensure immunization services in the midst of COVID 19 pandemic. Regular
 reviews were held with the States/ UTs to discuss challenges faced during the pandemic.
 - Communication materials were developed and shared with the States/UTs to ensure vaccination services following COVID appropriate behavior.
 - Two rounds of Mission Indradhanush were conducted to vaccinate children who had missed the vaccine doses during COVID-19 pandemic.
 - National and Subnational Immunization Days for Polio were conducted with COVID appropriate behavior.
