Sagarmala Scheme is a Central Sector Scheme of the Ministry of Ports, Shipping and Waterways intended to provide financial assistance to Major Ports / Non- Major Ports / State Governments/ State Maritime Boards / UTs / Other Government Agencies with a view to achieve the broad objective of promoting port-led development in India. Projects which are aligned to the objectives of Sagarmala Programme (port modernisation, efficiency improvement, ports connectivity, port-led industrialisation, coastal community, coastal shipping and waterways) are funded under Sagarmala Scheme which include capacity addition and new ports projects. Under sagarmala Scheme, financial assistance to tune of Rs. 1891.97 Crores have been granted to various Major Ports / Non- Major Ports / State Governments/ State Maritime Boards / UTs / Other Government Agencies for infrastructure projects, till date.
