EMPLOYABILITY AFTER VOCATIONAL COURSES

(a) the number of men and women enrolled in vocational courses, district-wise and State-wise; and

(b) the number of persons employed full-time and part-time after completing vocational courses, district-wise and State-wise?

Under Skill India Mission, the Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship (MSDE) (a) delivers skill training through Pradhan Mantri Kaushal Vikas Yojana (PMKVY), Jan Shikshan Sansthan (JSS) Scheme, National Apprenticeship Promotion Scheme (NAPS) and Craftsman Training Scheme (CTS) through Industrial Training Institutes (ITIs) to all sections of the society across India. The number of men and women trained in vocational courses, district-wise and State-wise under different schemes of MSDE during the year 2021-22 viz. PMKVY, JSS, CTS(ITIs) are at Annexure-I, Annexure-II and **Annexure-III.** Since the details in the said Annexures are too lengthy, it is available on the website of of Skill Development Entrepreneurship following the Ministry and at the link https://msde.gov.in/en/useful-links/parl-ques/rajya-sabha.

(c) Amongst the schemes of the MSDE, placements are specifically tracked under PMKVY. Under PMKVY, the number of persons that have been employed district wise and State-wise during the year 2021-22 at **Annexure-IV**. The third party Evaluation Report on PMKVY 2.0 (2016-20) found that average monthly income of PMKVY trained and certified individuals was 15% higher than the comparison group. Moreover, 76% of the candidates acknowledged that after the training, they have better chance of getting employment. Similarly, third party evaluation report of the JSS scheme observed that as an impact of the training programme conducted at JSSs, the self and wage employment and private job have become evident. The usefulness of the scheme is further evident from the fact that same report has mentioned that 77.05% of the beneficiary trainees have undergone occupational shifts. Also, the final report of Tracer Study of ITI Graduates mentions that 63.5% of total ITI pass-outs got employed (wage+ self, out of which 6.7% are self-employed).
