TRIBAL COMMUNITY IN NORTH EAST REGION

1736 SHRI RAKESH SINHA:

Will the Minister of TRIBAL AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

- (a) whether tribal community is marginalised in the North East Region, if so, how many of them are landless;
- (b) what is per capita income of tribal living in rural areas of the North East Region; and
- (c) how many tribals in the North East Region lost their land right in the last five years?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF STATE FOR TRIBAL AFFAIRS (SMT. RENUKA SINGH SARUTA)

- (a): In many parts of the North East Region, there is a system of community ownership of land, therefore land resources are being utilised through community ownership. However, as per Socio Economic and Caste Census(SECC), 2011 data, percentage of households with no land in rural areas of North East Region is 58.91. SECC 2011 data also reveals that percentage of ST landless households deriving major part of their income from manual casual labour is 17.6 % in comparison to 29.3% for all landless households in the rural areas of North Eastern Region.
- **(b):** Directorate of Economics & Statistics (DES) of respective State Governments prepares Per Capita Net State Domestic Product (NSDP) at Current Prices and Constant (2011-12) Prices, at State level. State wise Per Capita NSDP at current prices and constant prices for the North Eastern States for the year 2020-21, as prepared by respective DESs of North Eastern States which are provided by Ministry of Statistics & Programme Implementation (MoSPI), is given below:
