SCHEMES FOR PROMOTION OF INDUSTRIALIZATION

382. SHRI NEERAJ DANGI:

Will the Minister of **Commerce and Industry** be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the districts of industrially backwards States in the country have been identified by Government, if so, the details thereof;
- (b) the details of the schemes implemented by Government to promote industrialization during the last three years; and
- (c) the initiatives taken or the steps being taken or have been taken by Government to strengthen the industrial sector, especially in Rajasthan?

ANSWER

**THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF COMMERCE & INDUSTRY
(SHRI SOM PARKASH)**

- (a): Industry is a state subject. State Governments decide the industrially Backward Districts in their own States.
- (b)&(c): Government of India has taken up several schemes/initiatives for promotion of industries such as Startup India, Ease of doing business, Modified Industrial Infrastructure Upgradation scheme, Industrialisation in North Eastern Region including North East Industrial and Investment Promotion Policy and North East Industrial Development Scheme, Make in India in public procurement etc. Other measures for growth includes Atmanirbhar packages, introduction of Production Linked Incentive (PLI) Scheme in various Ministries, investment opportunities under National Infrastructure Pipeline (NIP) and National Monetisation Pipeline (NMP), India Industrial Land Bank (IILB), Industrial Park Rating System (IPRS), soft launch of the National Single Window System (NSWS), etc. An institutional mechanism to fast-track investments has been put in place, in the form of Project Development Cells (PDCs) in all concerned Ministries/ Departments of Government of India.

Keeping in view India's vision of becoming 'Atmanirbhar' and to enhance India's Manufacturing capabilities and Exports, an outlay of INR 1.97 lakh crore (over US\$

26 billion) has been announced in Union Budget 2021-22 for PLI schemes for 14 key sectors of manufacturing, starting from fiscal year (FY) 2021-22.

The consultants have been appointed for detailed master planning and preliminary engineering activities for an area of 558 Ha at KBNIR and 2659 Ha at JPMIA. The scope of the work includes cost estimates and expected employment generation of the projects.
	II. Jodhpur Pali Marwar Industrial Area (JPMIA)	ii. SPV namely Rajasthan Industrial Corridors Development Corporation Limited has been incorporated for KBNIR & JPMIA. State Government has not transferred any land parcel to the project SPV yet. iii. Initial equity contribution of Government of India (GoI) through National Industrial Corridor Development and Implementation Trust (NICDIT) (49%) amounting to Rs. 4.9 crore has been released for incorporation of the SPV.
