52. DR. JOHN BRITTAS:

Will the Minister of HOME AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the remit of the Committee vide Official Languages Act is only to review the progress made in the use of Hindi for official purposes of Union;
- (b) if so, whether the recent recommendations of the Committee regarding medium of instruction in Universities and professional institutions is ultra vires of the Act;
- (c) whether the said Act stipulates that English shall continue along with Hindi for all official purposes of Union and such other matters; and
- (d) whether Sec 3(5) of the Act provides for preserving the language provisions therein until resolutions to contrary have been passed by the State legislatures and Parliament?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS (SHRI AJAY KUMAR MISHRA)

(a) & (b): As per the Official Languages Act, 1963, the duty of Committee of Parliament on Official Language is to review the progress made in the use of Hindi for the official purposes of the Union and to submit its recommendations to the Competent Authority. As per the direction of the

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Competent Authority, these recommendations are laid on the Table of the

Parliament by the Ministry of Home Affairs and thereafter sent to the State

Governments, concerned stakeholders including Ministries/Departments of

the Government of India for their comments. After considering the

comments received from the State Governments, stakeholders etc., orders

are finally issued to accept/reject/modify the recommendations of the

Committee. The recent recommendations are under process.

Provision regarding medium of instruction in educational institutions is

stipulated in the National Education Policy (2020) which envisages

imparting more programs in higher education, using mother tongue/ local

language as medium of instruction, and/or offers programs bilingually.
