Drinking water projects in the State of Karnataka

577 Shri G.C. Chandrashekar:

Will the Minister of JAL SHAKTI be pleased to state:

- (a) the details of the newly formulated and launched Centrally Sponsored Schemes for Drinking Water and Sanitation in the State of Karnataka;
- (b) the details of the projects, estimated cost, amount released, year-wise; and
- (c) the progress status of each of the project as on today?

(a) to (c) Since August 2019, Government of India in partnership with States, is implementing Jal Jeevan Mission (JJM) – Har Ghar Jal to make provision of tap water supply to every rural household of the country, including in Karnataka, by 2024. As reported by the Government of Karnataka on the JJM-IMIS up to 07.12.2022, at the time of announcement of Jal Jeevan Mission in August 2019, 24.51 lakh (24.23%) rural households were reported to have tap water connections in Karnataka. Since then, tap water connections have been provided to additional 34.83 lakh (45.43%) rural households, in the State. As on 07.12.2022, out of total 101.17 lakh rural households in Karnataka, provision of tap water supply has been made to 59.34 lakh (58.65%) households.

And, to improve sanitation status in rural areas, Government had launched Swachh Bharat Mission (Grameen) [SBM(G)], with effect from 2nd October, 2014 with the main aim to make all the villages in the country Open Defecation Free (ODF) by 2nd October, 2019 by providing access to toilets to all the rural households. All the villages in the country, including Karnataka, had declared themselves ODF by 2nd October, 2019. Having achieved the ODF status, Phase II of SBM(G) has been launched with effect from 1st April, 2020, with the focus to sustain the ODF status and to cover all the villages in the country, including Karnataka, with solid and liquid waste management i.e. to convert the villages from ODF to ODF Plus by 2024-25. As reported by the Government of Karnataka on the SBM-G IMIS, out of total 26,437 villages, 16,010 villages have declared themselves ODF Plus as on 07.12.2022.

Drinking water and sanitation are state subjects. The responsibility to plan, design, approve and implement drinking water supply and sanitation schemes, lies with the States/UTs. Government of India supplements the efforts of the States by providing technical and financial assistance. As

such details of individual projects/ schemes for rural water supply and sanitation projects are not maintained centrally.

The year-wise details of funds allocated, released, and utilized by Karnataka under Jal Jeevan Mission (JJM) and Swachh Bharat Mission (Grameen) (SBM-G) for 2019-20, 2020-21, 2021-22 and 2022-23 are as under:
