OPENING OF KVs / JNVs IN MAHARASHTRA

234 SHRI DHANANJAY BHIMRAO MAHADIK:

Will the Minister of *Education* be pleased to state:

- (a) the number of Kendriya Vidyalayas (KVs) / Jawahar Navodaya Vidyalayas (JNVs) established in Maharashtra during the last three years, district-wise;
- (b) whether Government has implemented any scheme to establish new KVs / JNVs in all the districts of the State of Maharashtra and if so, the details thereof;
- (c) the number of districts of Maharashtra which have no KVs along with the names of such districts; and
- (d) by when KVs / JNVs are proposed to be established in such districts of the State?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF EDUCATION (SHRI DHARMENDRA PRADHAN)

(a) to (d) A statement is laid on the Table of the House.

STATEMENT REFERRED TO IN REPLY TO PARTS (a) TO (d) OF THE RAJYA SABHA STARRED QUESTION NO. 234 RAISED BY SHRI DHANANJAY BHIMRAO MAHADIK, HON'BLE MEMBER OF PARLIAMENT ANSWERED ON 22/03/2023 REGARDING OPENING OF KVs / JNVs IN MAHARASHTRA.

- (a) At present, 59 KVs and 34 JNVs are functioning in the State of Maharashtra. District-wise details are annexed. A KV was sanctioned in Gadchiroli in March, 2019 but could not be made functional as the requisite land and suitable rent free temporary accommodation, as per Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan (KVS) norms, has not yet been transferred to KVS.
- (b) to (d) Opening of new KVs is a continuous process. KVs are opened primarily to cater to the educational needs of the wards of transferable Central Government Employees including Defence & Para-military personnel, Central Autonomous Bodies, Central Public Sector Undertakings (PSUs) and Central Institute of Higher Learning (IHL) by providing a common programme of education throughout the country. Proposals for opening of new KVs may be sponsored by Ministries or Departments of the Government of India / State Governments / Union Territories (UTs) Administrations, with commitment to provide requisite resources including land and temporary accommodation for setting up a new KV as per norms. The proposals are subject to approval of the competent authority.

There are 16 districts of Maharashtra which do not have KVs viz. (i) Amravati (ii) Buldhana (iii) Beed (iv) Gondia (v) Hingoli (vi) Jalna (vii) Kolhapur (viii) Palghar (ix) Ratnagiri (x) Sangli (xi) Satara (xii) Sindhudurg (xiii) Nandurbar (xiv) Osmanabad, (xv) Akola, and (xvi) Gadchiroli.

The Navodaya Vidyalaya Scheme envisages opening of one JNV in each rural district of the country. There is no provision for JNVs in districts with 100% population in urban area. Opening of new JNVs is a continuous process which depends on the willingness of the concerned State Government / UT administration to make available requisite suitable land, free of cost, for construction of the permanent building and making available required temporary building, free of rent, to run the Vidyalaya till the permanent building is constructed. Sanction and opening of new JNV depends on approval by the competent authority. All the districts (as on 31st May, 2014) of the States / UTs, which have accepted the NVS Scheme have been covered, including Maharashtra (other than Mumbai and Mumbai Sub-Urban districts which have 100% urban population).
