Coal blocks offered to private companies

1309. SHRI VIKRAMJIT SINGH SAHNEY:

Will the Minister of COAL be pleased to state:

- (a) whether despite being world's fourth-largest producer, India is second-largest importer of dry-fuel i.e coal, if so, details thereof and reasons therefor;
- (b) number of coal blocks offered to private companies on revenue sharing basis in place of fixed cost in last five years, year-wise, State-wise;
- (c) details of coal bed methane (CBM) extraction rights auctioned from country;s coal mines in last three years, year-wise, State-wise; and
- (d) details of steps taken by Government to promote research and exploration activities and modern underground mass production technologies in last five years, year-wise, State-wise including Punjab.

<u>Answer</u>

MINISTER OF PARLIAMENTARY AFFAIRS, COAL AND MINES (SHRI PRALHAD JOSHI)

(a): India is the second largest coal producer and importer in the world. The details of coal produced and imported for the last four years are as under:-

Mainly, low ash coking coal and high grade coal are imported as their domestic production is either scarce or non-available. Imported coal-based (ICB) power plants of the coastal areas are specially designed to use imported coal only. Besides, coal being under open general license, is imported by traders and other users on commercial and logistic considerations.

- (d): There are two sub schemes for exploration of the coal and lignite under Central Sector scheme (CSS).
- 1. Promotional (Regional) Exploration for Coal & Lignite
- 2. Detailed Exploration in Non-CIL blocks

The achievement of exploration through CSS funding during last five years is as per **Annexure-I**.

CMPDIL has also carried out exploration through NMET funding. During 2021-22, CMPDIL has achieved 0.02 Lakh.m of drilling meterage through NMET funding in the State of Madhya Pradesh. No exploration work has been carried out in Punjab during last five years by CMPDIL.

CIL is in constant endeavor to promote Mass Production Technologies (MPT) using Continuous Miners (CM), Longwall (LW) and Highwalls (HW) in its underground (UG) mines across its subsidiaries wherever feasible to enhance its coal production capacities and efficiency from its UG mines. CIL operates its UG mines mainly in the States of West Bengal, Jharkhand, Odisha, Madhya Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, Maharashtra. CIL does not operate in the State of Punjab. During the last 5 years including current FY, 14 new CMs and 1 HW miners have been commissioned. The details are as follows:
