COMMON COMMUNICATION PLAN FOR COASTAL SECURITY

- (a) whether Government has any common communication plan to coordinate various security agencies for the coastal security of the country;
- (b) if so, the details thereof;
- (c)the details of the agencies coordinating the coastal security of the country; and
- (d) the details of major threats to country's coastal security?

- (a) to (d): Yes, Sir. A Common Communication Plan (COMPLAN) for Coastal Security has been promulgated by Dept. of Border Management (BM-II Division)/Ministry of Home Affairs for coordination among various agencies for the coastal security of the country. Under this COMPLAN following agencies are coordinating:-
 - (i) Indian Coast Guard
 - (ii) Indian Navy
 - (iii) State Marine Police/State Police
 - (iv) Customs/Immigration
 - (v) CISF/BSF
 - (vi) DG Shipping
 - (vii) Department of Fisheries (MoFAHD)
 - (viii) Ports/State Maritime Boards
 - (ix) Department of Forest & Environment
 - (x) State/UT Administration
 - (xi) Intelligence Agencies
 - (xii) Oil Handling Agencies
 - (xiii) Narcotics Control Bureau
 - (xiv) Directorate General of Lighthouse and Lightship
 - (xv) Director General of Shipping

Some of the major threats to Indian coastal security include illegal migrants, narcotics, smuggling, transgression of fishermen across IMBL, safety and protection of offshore terminals etc.
