Will the Minister of Education be pleased to state:

- (a) the details of Central Universities established by Government during the last five years, State-wise;
- (b) the number of Central Universities established during the last five years operating from their own buildings and those operating from the buildings of other institutions;
- (c) sanctioned and vacant posts in these universities;
- (d) whether their budget allocation has gone down during the last five years, if so, the reasons therefore; and
- (e) the details of courses, faculty, number of students and PhD scholars of Jio Institute that was declared 'center of eminence' in 2018?

(a) to (e) Six new Central Universities have been established under the administrative control of the Ministry of Education during last five years. The details are as under:-

Out of the above, last 3 central universities are in different phases of development and don't have their own buildings. The allocations of budget to the universities are made on the basis of their requirements. The Jio Institute has not been notified as Institute of Eminence (IOE) by the Government.
