VOCATIONAL TRAINING SCHEME FOR YOUTH

1723. SHRI RAJEEV SHUKLA:

Will the Minister of SKILL DEVELOPMENT AND ENTREPRENEURSHIP be pleased to state:

- (a) whether Government has introduced any vocational training scheme especially for the youth in country especially in the naxal affected areas of Chhattisgarh;
- (b) if so, the details thereof, State/ Region-wise; and
- (c) the details of the naxal affected areas which have been covered under the said scheme, State-wise?

ANSWER

(a) Under Skill India Mission, the Ministry of Skill Development & Entrepreneurship (MSDE) has been delivering short term skills through Pradhan Mantri Kaushal Vikas Yojana (PMKVY), Jan Shikshan Sansthan (JSS) Scheme and National Apprenticeship Promotion Scheme (NAPS), and long term skills through Craftsman Training Scheme (CTS) through Industrial Training Institutes (ITIs), to all sections of the society across all over India including naxal affected areas. The Directorate General of Training (DGT) under MSDE is implementing the scheme “Skill Development in 48 Districts affected by Left-Wing Extremism (LWE)” especially for the youth in the naxal affected areas including the state of Chhattisgarh. The outlay of the scheme is Rs 401.28 crore with duration of implementation upto 31 March 2024. The scheme inter-alia, envisages creation of infrastructure for 48 new Industrial Training Institutes (ITIs) at cost of Rs. 7.34 crore per ITI and 61 Skill Development Centres (SDCs) at cost of Rs. 0.50 crore per SDC. The scheme also has the provision of funding the Institute Management Committee (IMC) in 48 ITIs established under the scheme at cost of Rs. 1.00 crore per IMC. So far, the amount of Rs. 303.38 crore has been released under the scheme.
