GUIDELINES FOR INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT IN RAJASTHAN

1964 SHRI RAJENDRA GEHLOT:

Will the Minister of **Commerce and Industry** be pleased to state:

- (a) whether Government has issued any guidelines for industrial development in Rajasthan, if so, by when it is likely to be completed along with its salient features;
- (b) whether the said guidelines have been reviewed, if so, the details of the progress report thereof; and
- (c) whether the State of Rajasthan is itself responsible for its industrial development or whether it also receives assistance from the Central Government, if so, the details of the assistance received?

ANSWER

(a) to (c): Industries is primarily a State subject. The Central Government comes out with several initiatives and policies to promote industrialization in various parts of the country, including state of Rajasthan, from time to time.

In addition to ongoing schemes of various Departments and Ministries, Government has taken various other steps to boost domestic, foreign investments in India, Central Government has adopted several measures to promote and facilitate industrial development across States/UTs such as Make in India, Start Up India, PM Gati Shakti, National Infrastructure Pipeline (NIP), National Industrial Corridor Programme, Production Linked Incentive Scheme (PLI), promoting Ease of Doing Business (EoDB) and reducing compliance burden, National Single Window System (NSWS), India Industrial Land Bank (IILB), reforms in Foreign Direct Investment (FDI), Project Monitoring Group (PMG) etc which facilitates setting up of major infrastructure projects across the country. Also, an institutional mechanism to fast track investments has been put in place in the form of Project Development Cell (PDC) in all concerned Ministries/Departments of Government of India.

Keeping in view India's vision of becoming 'AtmaNirbhar Bharat' and to enhance India's manufacturing capabilities and exports, an outlay of Rs.1.97 lakh crore (over US \$ 26 billion) has been announced in Union Budget 2021-22 for Production Linked incentives(PLI) scheme for 14 key sectors of manufacturing starting from FY 2021-22.
