Will the Minister of AGRICULTURE & FARMERS WELFARE be pleased to state:

- (a) whether Government has conducted any survey during 2022 to ascertain the increase in cost of production, income of farmers and increase in remunerative price for agricultural products;
- (b) if so, the details thereof along with details of findings of the survey regarding increase in cost of production, income and remunerative prices for farmers during last three years, State-wise and year-wise;
- (c) if not, the reasons therefore and whether Government would conduct any survey during 2023 to ascertain above aspects; and
- (d) if not, the reasons therefore?

(a) to (d): The "Comprehensive Scheme for Studying the Cost of Cultivation of Principal Crops in India (CS Scheme)" has been implemented since 1971. The Scheme envisages collection of representative data from farmers regularly on yearly basis on inputs and outputs in physical and monetary terms on a comparable and comprehensive basis following a scientific sampling. The all-India projected cost of production in respect of mandated 23 crops for the last 3 years is given in **Annexure-I**.

While recommending Minimum Support Prices (MSP), the Commission for Agricultural Costs and Prices (CACP) considers important factors like cost of production, overall demand -supply situation, price trends in domestic and global prices, inter-crop price parity, terms of trade between agriculture and non-agriculture sector, likely impact of price policy on the rest of the economy, rational utilization of land, water and other production resources and a minimum of 50% as margin over cost of production (as announced by the Government of India in its Union Budget 2018-19 and effective since then). The MSP of mandated crops for the last three years is at **Annexure II**.
