**PM-AASHA SCHEME**

2737. DR. ASHOK KUMAR MITTAL :

Will the Minister of AGRICULTURE AND FARMERS WELFARE be pleased to state:

- (a) Number of beneficiaries under Pradhan Mantri Annadata Aay SanraksHan Abhiyan (PM-AASHA) scheme, since its launch;
- (b) funds allocated, released and spent under the scheme since its launch;
- (c) amount of pulses, oilseeds and copra procured by central nodal agencies under the PSS component of the scheme;
- (d) percentage of the marketable surplus of farmers for eligible crops, achieved by Government; and
- (e) whether Government has taken any measures to address the issues of delay in payments, lack of infrastructure at procurement centers, distance from procurement centers and delayed announcement of MSP rates under the scheme, the details thereof ?

**ANSWER**

(a) to (c) : The procurement details of pulses, oilseeds and copra procured at Minimum Support Price (MSP) by Central Nodal agencies and the number of farmers benefitted under Price Support Scheme (PSS) since the launch of PM-AASHA i.e. 2018-19 season is at Annexure-I and Budget Estimates (BE), Revised Estimates (RE) and Expenditure since 2018-19 is at Annexure-II .

(d) & (e): Under the scheme, payments to the farmers are made strictly through Real Time Gross Settlement (RTGS) or National Electronic Fund Transfer (NEFT) by the procuring agencies within three days of purchase of their produce. Further, for making effective procurement by Government agencies at MSP and providing maximum benefits of MSP to the farmers, procurement centres are opened by respective State Government Agencies and Central Nodal Agencies after taking into account the production, marketable surplus, convenience of farmers and availability of other logistics / infrastructure such as storage and transportation etc. large number of the purchase centres in addition to the existing Mandis and depots / godowns are also established at key points for the convenience of farmers to ensure procurement at MSP and also to prevent sale below MSP. The MSP are announced well before the sowing season so that the farmers can take an informed decision for sowing a particular crop.

The farmers have option to sell their food grains at the Government purchase centers and if they gets better terms and price in comparison to MSP, they are free to sell their produce in open market. Moreover, the overall market also responds to declaration of MSP and Government's procurement operations which results in private procurement on or above the MSP for various notified food grains.
