FOOD STORAGE FACILITIES IN MAHARASHTRA

2779 SHRI SANJAY RAUT:

Will the Minister of CONSUMER AFFAIRS, FOOD AND PUBLIC DISTRIBUTION be pleased to state:

- (a) the number of Government godowns that are available for storing foodgrains and vegetables in Maharashtra, district-wise;
- (b) whether available godowns are sufficient to meet the requirement of storing foodgrains and vegetables in Maharashtra and if so, the details thereof and if not, the corrective steps taken in this regard;
- (c) the details of the beneficiaries who receive highly subsidized foodgrains under the National Food Security Act (NFSA), State/UT-wise particularly in Maharashtra;
- (d) whether Government proposes to review the percentage of beneficiaries covered under NFSA in the country again, and if so, the details thereof?

A N S W E R MINISTER OF STATE FOR MINISTRY OF RURAL DEVELOPMENT AND CONSUMER AFFAIRS, FOOD & PUBLIC DISTRIBUTION (SADHVI NIRANJAN JYOTI)

(a) & (b): With respect to Department of Food & Public Distribution (DFPD), Government of India District-wise godowns of Central Warehousing Corporation (CWC) that are available in Maharashtra for storage including food grains and vegetables are at Annexure-I.

Further, Food Corporation of India (FCI) mainly stores Wheat & Rice after procurement for PDS operation and to maintain buffer stock. As on 01.03.2023, 70 godowns of FCI (owned and hired) are available in Maharashtra for storing of foodgrains. District-wise details are at Annexure-II. Maharashtra is consuming region and a Decentralized Procurement (DCP) State. Procurement, Storage & Distribution of food grains is carried out by State Government through its nodal agency. Since, Procurement in Maharashtra is lesser than requirement of Wheat and Rice under National Food Security Act (NFSA)/Other Welfare Schemes (OWS), so the balance stock is provided from Central Pool by movement from surplus states. Maharashtra has adequate storage capacity in excess of four months requirement which is the norm for DCP consuming state.

FCI continuously assesses and monitors the storage capacity and based on the storage gap assessment, storage capacities are created/hired through the following schemes:

- 1. Construction of Silos under Public Privates Partnership (PPP) mode
- 2. Private Entrepreneurs Guarantee (PEG) Scheme
- 3. Central Sector Scheme (CSS)
- 4. Hiring of godown from Central Warehousing Corporation (CWC)/ State Warehousing Corporations (SWCs)/ State Agencies
- 5. Hiring of godown through Private Warehousing Scheme (PWS)

Department of Agriculture & Farmers Welfare (DA&FW) is implementing Mission for Integrated Development of Horticulture (MIDH) scheme for holistic development of horticulture under which financial assistance is available for setting up of Post-Harvest Management (PHM) infrastructure including establishment of cold storages for perishable horticultural produce only and not for godowns for the storage of food grains. The component is demand/entrepreneur driven for which Government assistance in the form of credit linked back ended subsidy is available at the rate of 35% of the eligible project cost in general areas and at the rate of 50% of the eligible project cost in hilly and scheduled areas through respective State Horticulture Missions (SHMs). Currently there are cold storages having capacity of 5.547 Million MT under MIDH.

(c) & (d): The Targeted Public Distribution System (TPDS) is now governed as per the provisions of the National Food Security Act, 2013 which provides for coverage of upto 75% of the rural population and upto 50% of the urban population, which at Census 2011 comes to 81.35 crore persons. At present, against the intended coverage of 81.35 crore, 80.11 crore beneficiaries are identified by the States/UTs under the Act. State/UT wise details are at Annexure-III.

Section 9 of the National Food Security Act, 2013 (NFSA) provides that the percentage coverage under the Targeted Public Distribution System in rural and urban areas for each State shall be determined by the Central Government and the total number of persons to be covered in the State shall be calculated on the basis of the population estimates as per the census of which the relevant figures have been published. As at the time of implementation of NFSA, the latest published figures of Census pertained to the year 2011, the same was used to determine the coverage of all States/Union Territories (UTs). At present, no proposal to review the percentage of beneficiaries covered under NFSA is under consideration in NFSA Division of Department of Food & Public Distribution, Government of India.
