STATEMENT REFERRED TO IN REPLY TO PARTS (a) TO (d) OF UNSTARRED QUESTION NO. 2848 BY SHRI AJIT KUMAR BHUYAN ANSWERED IN RAJYA SABHA ON 24.03.2023 REGARDING SETTING UP A RAILWAY LINE THROUGH KAZIRANGA NATIONAL PARK

- (a) and (b): Kaziranga Tiger Reserve, situated in Assam, is a UNESCO world Heritage site of India, having an area of 1173.58 sq. km. (core and buffer). The forests, wetlands and grasslands of Kaziranga Tiger Reserve are home to tigers, elephant and the world's largest population of Indian one-horned Rhinoceroses.
- (c) and (d): Yes, Sir. Salona Khumtai (99 km) new Railway line through southern boundary of Kaziranga National Park and Tiger Reserve has been included in Budget 2017-18 subject to requisite Government approvals. Preparation of Detailed Project Report for setting up this new Railway line has been taken up. The project is not sanctioned, as such, the proposals for clearance to National Board for Wildlife (NBWL) and Ministry of Environment Forest and Climate Change (MoEF&CC) have not been taken up.
