### **UDAN SCHEME**

Will the Minister of CIVIL AVIATION be pleased to state:-

- (a) whether UDAN Scheme has transformed the aviation sector making air travel accessible for common man;
- (b) if so, the number of small and medium cities which are connected by air service to big cities and the details of the routes where air service has started;
- (c) the number of people travelled so far under the UDAN Scheme; and
- (d) the number of additional airports which are operational now due to UDAN Scheme?

(a) to (d): The Ministry of Civil Aviation has launched the Regional Connectivity Scheme (RCS) - UDAN (Ude Desh ka Aam Nagrik) on 21-10-2016 to stimulate regional air connectivity and making air travel affordable for the common man. UDAN has transformed the way people travel from Tier-2 and Tier-3 cities of the country. Regional airports like Jharsuguda, Kishangarh, Belgaum, Hubli, Darbhanga, etc. have been witnessing exponential growth in air traffic.

Under the UDAN scheme, as on 31.01.2023, a total of 461 routes have commenced, operationalising 73 Airports including 2 Water Aerodromes & 9 Heliports. Over 113 lakh passengers have travelled by UDAN flights since its inception.
