KENDRIYA VIDYALAYAS IN BACKWARD AREAS OF THE COUNTRY

Will the Minister of *Education* be pleased to state:-

- (a) whether Government has decided to start Kendriya Vidyalayas (KVs) in backward areas of the country;
- (b) if so, the details thereof, State-wise;
- (c) whether blocks have been identified for setting up of KVs; and
- (d) if so, the details thereof along with the criteria for selection of such blocks?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF EDUCATION (SMT. ANNPURNA DEVI)

(a) to (d) At present, 1249 Kendriya Vidyalayas (KVs) are functioning across the country. Opening of new KVs is a continuous process. KVs are opened primarily to cater to the educational needs of the wards of transferable Central Government Employees including Defence & Para-military personnel, Central Autonomous Bodies, Central Public Sector Undertakings (PSUs) and Central Institute of Higher Learning (IHL) by providing a common programme of education throughout the country. Proposals for opening of new KVs may be sponsored by Ministries or Departments of the Government of India / State Governments / Union Territories (UTs) Administrations, with commitment to provide requisite resources for setting up a new KV as per norms. The proposals are subject to approval of the competent authority. KVs are not opened on the criteria of State/UT/District/Backward area.
