INCIDENCE OF SUICIDES AMONG CHILDREN

3252 SHRI JOSE K. MANI:

Will the Minister of HOME AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

- (a) whether Government has details of the number of children who died by suicides in the country over the last five years;
- (b) if so, State-wise details thereof;
- (c) whether Government has conducted any enquiry or research to find out the reasons behind increasing incidence of suicides among children;
- (d) if so, details thereof; and
- (e) details of the policies taken to prevent suicides among children?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS (SHRI AJAY KUMAR MISHRA)

- (a) & (b): National Crime Records Bureau (NCRB) compiles and publishes statistical data on crimes in its publication "Crime in India". The published reports are available until year 2021. The State/UT-wise details of number of suicides committed by children (below 18 years) in the country during the year 2017-21 is enclosed at Annexure.
- (c) to (e) Ministry of Education has undertaken a proactive initiative, named "Manodarpan" covering a wide range of activities to provide psychosocial support to students, teachers and families for Mental Health and Emotional Well being during the COVID outbreak and beyond. A webpage for

Manodarpan has been created on the Website of the Ministry of Education, which contains advisory, practical tips, posters, videos, do's and don'ts for psychosocial support, FAQs and online query system. Further, the National Council of Educational Research and Training (NCERT) has started "NCERT Counselling Services for School Children" in April, 2020 to help school students across the country to share their concerns.

Ministry of Health & Family welfare, Government of India is supporting implementation of the District Mental Health Programme (DMHP) under the National Mental Health Programme (NMHP) in 716 districts of the country for which support is provided to States/UTs through the National Health Mission. Facilities made available under DMHP at the Community Health Centre (CHC) and Primary Health Centre (PHC) levels, inter-alia, include outpatient services, assessment, counselling/ psychosocial interventions, continuing care and support to persons with severe mental disorders, drugs, outreach services, ambulance services etc. In addition to above services there is a provision of 10 bedded in-patient facility at the District level. The objectives of DMHP are:

 to provide suicide prevention services, work place stress management, life skills training and counselling in schools and colleges.

- ii. to provide mental health services including prevention, promotion and long-term continuing care at different levels of district healthcare delivery system.
- iii. to augment institutional capacity in terms of infrastructure, equipment and human resource for mental healthcare.
- iv. to promote community awareness and participation in the delivery of mental health care services.

Ministry of Health & Family welfare has also formulated our country's first National Suicide Prevention Strategy. The Strategy is available on the website of Ministry of Health & Family welfare (www.mohfw.gov.in)

In addition to above, Mental healthcare services have also been added in the package of services under Comprehensive Primary Health Care under Ayushman Bharat-HWC Scheme. Operational guidelines on Mental, Neurological, and Substance Use Disorders (MNs) at Health and Wellness Centers (HWC) have been released under the ambit of Ayushman Bharat. Ministry of Women and Child Development has signed a Memorandum of Understanding with NIMHANS to establish a National Initiative & Integrated Resource Centre for Child Protection, Mental Health, and Psychosocial Care named "SAMVAD" at NIMHANS, at Bangalore.
