Increased threat to Gangetic dolphins due to cruise ships

35. SHRI MALLIKARJUN KHARGE:

Will the Minister of ENVIRONMENT, FOREST AND CLIMATE CHANGE be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is a fact that cruise ships and increased river traffic in river Ganges and its tributaries could threaten the Gangetic dolphins
- (b) if so, the details thereof;
- (c) whether the Ministry has carried out any Environmental Impact Assessment studies in this regard;
- (d) if so, the details thereof; and
- (e) if not, the reasons therefor?

ANSWER

- (a) and (b) Short-term study conducted in Ganges river indicates that there are some effects of boat traffic on the behaviour of Ganges River Dolphins.
- (c) and (d) The Inland Waterways Authority of India has carried Environmental Impact Assessment studies for National Waterway-1 (Ganga-Bhagirathi-Hoogly river system), which included:
 - (i) Study on Environmental and Social Impact Assessment, Environmental Management Plan and Resettlement Action Plan, 2016.
 - (ii) Oil Spill Contingency Management Plan for National Waterway-1 and Haldia Terminal, 2016.
 - (iii) Risk Assessment and Disaster Management Plan for National Waterway-1, 2018.
 - (iv) Study on the effect of navigational activities on Dolphin in the National waterway-1, 2020.
- (e) In view of above, question does not arise.
