STATEMENT REFERRED TO IN REPLY TO PARTS (a) TO (e) OF UNSTARRED QUESTION NO. 3502 BY MS. DOLA SEN ANSWERED IN RAJYA SABHA ON 31.03.2023 REGARDING SIVOK- RANGPO RAIL PROJECT

(a) and (b): Yes, Sir. Detailed Design Consultants have been appointed to conduct the Environment Impact Studies to assess potential effect of Sivok-Rangpo new line project (44 km) on the environment. They have conducted the Environment Impact Studies and given Environment Management Plan. Continuous monitoring is being done and remedial measures have been taken during project execution to avoid any adverse impact on the environment.

(c) to (e): Yes, Sir. 72 families were displaced/relocated due to land acquisition for Sivok-Rangpo new line project. These families were given alternative land by State Government and compensation amount of ₹106.43 crore was also given to these families through State Government of West Bengal and Sikkim.
