TEXTILE POLICIES FOR INFRASTRUCTURAL DEVELOPMENT

3508. DR. ANIL SUKHDEORAO BONDE:

Will the Minister of TEXTILES be pleased to state:

- (a) whether Government proposes to restructure its textile policies for infrastructural development to achieve a growth target;
- (b) if so, the details thereof;
- (c) whether Government has sought cooperation from major international players to collaborate with Indian textile industry in the manufacture of fabric and fermenting;
- (d) if so, the outcome thereof along with the steps taken by Government in this regard;
- (e) whether the Ministry of Finance has turned down the proposal of the Ministry to restructure the textiles sector loans; and
- (f) if so, the details thereof and the reasons therefor?

ANSWER

(a) & (b): As a policy measure for enhancing infrastructure facilities for textile sector, Government has introduced Pradhan Mantri Mega Integrated Textile Region and Apparel Parks (PM-MITRA) Scheme for setting up 7 Mega Textiles Parks which aims to develop integrated large scale and modern industrial infrastructure facility for entire value-chain of the textile industry including weaving and processing sector and will enhance the production and competitiveness of the textiles industry and create employment opportunities.

(c) & (d): In order to promote the Indian Textile Industry globally, Government has approved Production Linked Incentive Scheme (PLI) for Textiles to enhance production of high value Man Made Fibre (MMF) Fabric & Apparel and Technical Textiles in the country to enable the textiles industry to achieve size and scale and to become competitive. 64 applicants have been selected under the scheme
