Introduction of Common University Entrance Test

3703 Shri Deepender Singh Hooda:

Will the Minister of Education be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is a fact that the introduction of the Common University Entrance Test (CUET) contributed to significant decline in the enrolment of students especially female students in Delhi University in graduation courses;
- (b) if so, the details thereof;
- (c) what is the enrolment percentage of students belonging to Haryana State in Delhi University in graduation courses in last three years; and
- (d) whether there is any downfall in the number of students of Haryana region in Delhi University in graduation courses after introduction of CUET?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF EDUCATION (DR. SUBHAS SARKAR)

(a) to (d): University of Delhi has informed that it has filled almost all the seats advertised for admission through the Common University Entrance Test (CUET). In 2021 for Undergraduate Admissions women and men candidates were 62.85% and 37.15% respectively while in 2022 for Undergraduate Admissions, women and men candidates were 59.5% and 40.05% respectively. However, region-wise data is not maintained by the University.
